Tripura hosts state level 'Meri Mati Mera Desh' at Agartala

'Meri Mati Mera Desh' programme, as part of the closing segment of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' has been able to rekindle the patriotic fervor in the citizens of the country. We all should keep the matter of our country above everything. In any situation all people of the country should stand united, stated the chief minister Prof. (Dr.) Manik Saha today at the state level Meri Mati Mera Desh programme held at Scrap Garden in front of the Secretariat, Agartala. He said, we address our country as motherland and to ignite the feeling of patriotism Meri Mati Mera Desh has been organized. Through this programme Prime Minister Narendra Modi has engraved the patriotic thought of motherland among the people of the country.

The programme this morning began with a rally starting from Circuit House area in which the chief minister, other members of the State Council of Ministers, MLAs, Corporators of Agartala Municipal Corporation, other public representatives and common people had a spontaneous participation.
