

21st programme of Mukhyamantri Samipeshu
Chief Minister's directed the official to help Shatrupa-Mausumi

People from different parts of the state met Chief Minister Prof. (Dr.) Manik Saha on October 18, 2023 in 21st Mukhyamantri Samipeshu programme. Like other days at the Chief Minister's official residence, the Chief Minister listened to the grievances and various problems of the people from different parts of the state for a long time. Most of them came with requests for medical assistance. The Chief Minister after listening to everyone's problems directed the Secretaries and officials of the concerned departments to take necessary initiatives.

Daily labourer Ranu Dhar, a resident of Kamalpur Manik Bhandar, is facing difficulties in getting his cancer-stricken daughter Shatarupa Dhar treated due to financial instability. Shatarupa is currently undergoing treatment at Agartala Cancer Hospital. Uttam Saha, a resident of Shivanagar met the Chief Minister seeking help for the treatment of his cancer-stricken wife Moushumi Saha. The Chief Minister directed the Medical Superintendent of Agartala Cancer Hospital to arrange necessary treatment for Shatrupa Dhar and Moushumi Saha. The husband of Anima Chakraborty of Kamalpur suffered serious leg injuries after falling in the backyard. She came to get help for her husband's treatment. Sophia Begum, a resident of Fulbari in Unakoti district, came to get help for her son Rahul Ahmed's eye treatment. Similarly, Rampada Sutradhar, a resident of Gangail Road in Agartala, met the Chief Minister seeking medical help for his son suffering from kidney problems. The Chief Minister saw the medical documents of everyone and directed the Medical Superintendent of GB Hospital Dr. Shankar Chakraborty to take necessary action. Parthajit Chakraborty of Sabroom met the Chief Minister appealing for help for the treatment of his cancer-stricken father. The Chief Minister directed to arrange financial assistance from the Department of Social Welfare and Social Education for medical assistance.

Vidisha Das Majumdar, a resident of Jagannath bari area, met the Chief Minister during the Mukhyamantri Samipeshu programme requesting help for her husband's treatment.
