

National Lok Adalat on August 13

District Legal Services Authority, West Tripura is going to organize the National Lok Adalat, 2022 on 13th August, 2022 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m at the Court Premises of the Ld. District & Sessions Judge, West Tripura, Agartala, Ld. Judge, Family Court, West Tripura, Agartala & Ld. Chief Judicial Magistrate, West Tripura, Agartala. For this there will be 11 Lok Adalat Courts/ Benches for disposal of Pending Cases. Out of the total pending cases there will be 94 of MAC Cases, 30 Matrimonial Disputes, 50 Criminal Compoundable Cases, 3 Negotiable Instruments Cases, 32 other Civil Cases, 1517 MV ACT Cases, 764 TP Act Cases & 441 Bank Loan Recovery Cases.

CM inaugurates new building of Community Health Centre at Notun Bazar

The state government is making efforts to provide better health services to all sections of the people. For this purpose special priority has been given on building infrastructure to improve health services. Agartala Government Medical College Hospital now provides good neuro surgery treatment. Besides this, initiatives have also been taken to launch other super specialty units. Chief Minister Prof. (Dr.)

Manik Saha said this on 10th August, 2022 while inaugurating a new building of Notun Bazar Community Health Centre in Amarpur sub-division. He said that the work of establishing a medical college will be started very soon in Ambasa of Dhalai district.

Chief Minister said that Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakaram (JSSK) scheme is implemented in the state. Free treatment is being provided to pregnant mothers and new born children under this scheme. Regular health camps are being conducted in remote areas. Under the

“Tripura Health Assurance Scheme for Poor” 12 crore 46 lakhs 8 thousand has been disbursed to 2,118 beneficiaries so far this year. To make Tripura a drug free state therapy centre has been set up at various places including Vangmun Health Centre, Kumarghat Community Health Centre, Kailashahar District Hospital and Damchara Health Centre.

In the inaugural address, Chief Minister Prof. Dr. Manik Saha also said, Agartala Government Medical College has increased the number of seats from 63 to 79 at postgraduate level. For this, 50 percent seats will be allocated for state quota and 50 percent for all-India quota. 25 seats have been increased from last year in MBBS course. As a result, the number of seats in the course has increased from 100 to a total of 125. So far, four Nursing Institutes have been established. A pharmacy institute with 100 seats has been set up. 265 seats has been increased in nursing courses. The number of seats has been increased from 30 to 60 in RIPSAT B.Pharm course. The children of the state will benefit from this initiative of the state government. Besides, 156 new MBBS doctors have been appointed. Dental surgeon will be recruited through TPSC very soon. Mobile food testing lab has already been launched.

Chief Minister said that just constructing new buildings will not speed up health services. This needs everyone’s cooperation. It is everyone’s responsibility to keep the hospital clean. Just as a temple is a holy place, a hospital should also look like a temple. Chief Minister said that doctors and health workers should treat patients and their families well who come for hospital services. Similarly, trust or confidence should be placed on doctors for medical services because no doctor wants ill health for patients. Chief Minister also urged everyone to make the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign a success on August 13 to 15 on the occasion of the 75th Independence Day celebrations.

MLA Ranjit Das and Gomati District District Magistrate Ravel Hamendra Kumar among others spoke at the programme. Director of Family Welfare and Disease Prevention Department, Dr. Radha Debbarma gave a welcome speech. It should be noted that 5 crore 2 lakh rupees have been spent on the construction of the new building for this Community health centre with 30 beds allocated by the National Health Mission. Amarpur BAC Chairman Sumanta Reang, Notun bazar Agri Produce Market Committee Chairman Sanjay Chakraborty, District Police Superintendent Shashvat Kumar, CMO Dr. Niru Mohan Jamatia and others were present at the programme.

Sumangal Chakma, headmaster of Notun bazar Higher Secondary School, was felicitated by the Department of Health for taking an important role in the covid vaccination of the students of his own school as well as the students of other schools during the Covid period. Besides this, four students were also felicitated at the programme. After the inauguration, Chief Minister visited various departments of the new Community health center and inquired about the infrastructure. CM also participated in the tree plantation programme at the hospital premises.

Tribal welfare minister inaugurates new building of Borok International School

Under the centrally funded scheme called Special Economic Development Package, for NLFT (NB) Returnees Group, a newly constructed building of Borok International School was formally inaugurated by the tribal welfare minister Rampada Jamatia today at Hokutwisa (Dhumachera) under Longtharai Valley subdivision of Dhalai district in presence of MLA Diba Chandra Hrangkhawl, MDC Sanjoy Das and other dignitaries.

Addressing the gathering there the tribal welfare minister said, for accomplishing various development activities and promoting such purpose, our

concentration and application should be initiated through moral education in a democratic manner. He said, the present sanctioned and disbursed 10 per cent fund of the total budget to respective Village Committee or Panchayat office as per population status for all round development following all norms. It is a priority of the present government to establish educational institutions of various disciplines.

The tribal welfare minister further said, it is everyone's responsibility that skilful and talented children are identified and taken care of, so as to encourage the families of rural and remote habitations for coming forward in every field. In the context of Borok International School also the minister urged all specially the teachers and guardians to extend their co-operation in promoting this school as an ideal residential school.

MLA and BAC chairman of Mani RD Block Diba Chandra Hrangkhawl, in his speech, reminded and urged the school

management committee that quality and value education should be ensured in the school.

It is to be noted that Borok International School was established in 2013 and out of Rs. 6 crore sanctioned under the said package, so far Rs. 1.5 crore has been spent for construction purpose. Construction of other buildings is under progress. The existing infrastructure consists of 2 staff rooms, 8 class rooms with 110 students and 17 teaching and non-teaching staff. The construction work has been implemented under the supervision of RD department.

Among others present on the occasion included ADM, Dhalai district Ajit Shukla Das, joint director of tribal welfare department Vanlaldika Darlong, senior leader and social activists of Japahamkrai Motha, Buchuk Borok, Ananta Debbarma and Daniel Borok and alike. The said programme was organised by tribal welfare department in association with Japahamkrai Motha former Returnees Group and School Management Committee.

Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) awareness Camp at Khowai
