

11 Labour Welfare

- Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Mandhan Pension scheme has been launched for the welfare of un-organized labourers. Rickshaw-pullers, hawkers, Safai workers come under this scheme. Till date, 28,626 un-organized labourers have registered their names under this programme.
- Rashtriya Pension Yojana is a central pension scheme for the traders and self-employed persons. So far, total 1,222 traders and self-employed persons have been covered under the Rashtriya Pension Yojana.

12 Kakkorok & other Minority Languages

- Since the new government took over, during the last three years Kakkorok language has been incorporated as a subject in 116 schools of the state. New advisory committee has been formed for seven languages including Kakkorok.
- To encourage teaching in mother tongue during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 academic year Chakma, Garo, Manipuri and Bishnupriya Manipuri languages have been introduced in higher classes.
- Non-text books are being published for the development of minority languages.

13 Power

- Extension of electrical line is in progress in full swing under - Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Jyoti Yojana with involvement of Rs. 74.12 crore (Phase I) and Rs.358.64 crore (Phase-II).
- In order to repair and develop the power transmission system Integrated Power Development Scheme is being implemented in 20 cities of the state by spending Rs. 203.02 crore Central fund. By installation of LED bulb and tube light under UJALA Yojana 27 MW electricity could be saved which is equivalent to about 10% reduction in peak hour demand.
- To ensure 100% power connectivity in rural houses with involvement of Rs. 417.53 crore Pradhan Mantri Sahaj Bijli Har Ghar Yojana has been implemented. The state has already achieved 100 per cent coverage in this.
- For developed billing system prepaid meters are being installed for 1.84 lakh consumers of urban and suburban areas and the work is expected to be completed by March, this year.
- For speedy disposal, complaints can be lodged by dialing 1912 in Bengali, Hindi, Kakkorok and English in the Smart Customer Care System.

14 General Administration (Political)

- The pension amount for the Reang freedom fighters has been increased from Rs. 1000 to Rs. 1,600. The freedom fighters and their dependents are being given freedom fighter honorarium (Central). Their state pension has been increased from Rs. 500 to Rs. 800.
- The monthly allowance of the veteran soldiers of the Second World War has been increased from Rs. 6,000 to Rs. 10,000. The family pension of the soldiers who lost life in the Second World War has been increased from Rs. 4000 to Rs. 10,000.
- A Protocol Cell and a Co-ordination Cell have been opened in the general administration department (political) for the hospitality of official guests and officers of the Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Home Affairs.

15 Land Records & Settlement

- E-Payment Gateway has been launched for paying fees for registration and computerized Khatian. Khatian is being provided online.
- Land banking has been created by amalgamating all government lands and all information regarding this has been uploaded on <http://www.jamitripura.gov.in>. However, at present this can be accessed only by the revenue officers. Very soon this website will be opened for the public use. Digitised information of last 30 years' land transactions has been uploaded. Before going for any permanent asset dealing citizens could get the latest updates on their assets from this website.
- To make available value of any land online, e-Jami system has been launched on February 2,2020.

16 Economics & Statistics

- The 7th Economic Survey through a mobile App was first launched in Tripura in 2019 in the country. Through the Common Service Centres (CSCs) this survey was executed in every district. From this survey it came to the light that there are 5,11,127 trade units of different sizes in the state. A total of 7,83,694 people are employed in these trade units.
- The GSDP in the state was Rs. 43,715.80, Rs. 49,845.47, Rs. 55,984.08, and Rs. 59,752.61 in the 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21 financial year respectively. Similarly, NSDP was Rs. 39,504.63, Rs. 44,834.99, Rs. 50,226.55 and Rs. 53,119.97 respectively. Per capita income in the state has reached Rs. 1,31,128 in 2020-21 financial year, which was Rs. 1,00,444, Rs. 1,12,849 and Rs. 1,25,191 in 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20 financial year respectively.
- The National Sample Survey report has been uploaded in the department's portal www.ecostat.tripura.gov.in

17 Factories & Boilers Organisation

- During the last three years 286 new factories have been identified, registered and issued license to. Inspection has been carried out in 2,915 factories. One hundred and five security related programmes have been organized. Non-tax revenue collection has been calculated at Rs. 139 lakh. Show cause notice has been issued on 26 occasions for violating Factories Act and regulations and 22 cases have been lodged for the same reason.
- Online service has been launched for factory registration, renewal of license, payment of fee, submission of application for license etc.

18 Urban Development:

- The Tripura Urban Planning and Development Authority (TUDA) has decided to develop an IT park and township project.
- Rate of daily wage has been increased under Tripura Urban Employment Programme (TUEP).
- Tripura has attained first position among the North-eastern states and second position at the national level in implementation of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban).
- Construction of 1000 multi-storey flats is going on at Akhaura for the lower income group people under Light House project.
- Rs. 10,000 loan is being given to street vendors for their self-reliance under the Pradhan Mantri Street Vendors Atmanirbhar Nidhi scheme.
- Twenty urban local bodies were declared ODF in 2019. Under IHHL scheme 19,773 toilets have been constructed in the areas under 20 urban local bodies.

19 Youth Affairs & Sports

- As part of development of sports infrastructure six open gyms have been opened in four districts and five more open gyms will be opened at Agartala, Belonia, Sepahijala, Sabroom and Damchera.
- Three synthetic tennis courts have been constructed at Dasarath Deb Sports Complex. Construction of synthetic football turf in Chandrapur ground in Gomati district has been completed.
- Construction of one 200 - seater youth hostel at Ambassa in Dhalai district and a 100-bedded boys hostel at the Regional Physical Training Institute, Panisagar in North Tripura district is going on.
- A multi-purpose hall for Judo, Weight lifting, Table Tennis, Karate etc. sports and an independent badminton hall have been constructed at NSRCC complex, Agartala. These were inaugurated on November 30, 2020.

20 Information & Cultural Affairs

- Padmashri Thanga Darlong and Padmashri Benichandra Jamatia are the brightest treasures in the revivalist history of Tripura's decaying culture. They have made Tripura proud at the national level.
- The tableau of Tripura secured first position by taking part in the Republic Day parade on Rajpath, New Delhi in 2019 and second position in the 2021 Republic Day parade.
- For the first time in the state initiative has been taken to officially enlist and categorise in grades the artistes and cultural organizations of the state.
- On the occasion of Statehood Day 2021, five citizen awards and other Statehood Day awards were introduced for remarkable contribution to different fields.
- The Tripura Media Representative Accreditation Guidelines 2020 has been introduced for the journalists of the state.
- Initiative has been taken to launch a health insurance scheme for the working journalists of the state.
- For the interest of the journalists four committees in the Information and Cultural Affairs department have been reconstituted.
- So far PRESS jackets have been given to 264 journalists of the state. Process is underway to distribute 300 more PRESS jackets among the journalists.

3 Years of PEOPLE'S GOVERNMENT

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*Tripura on Road
to Self-Reliance*

01 Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare

- PM Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM KISAN): - So far details of a total of 2,51,230 farmers have been uploaded in the portal and out of this number, 2,32,393 farmers have been registered under the scheme. Till date an amount of Rs. 271.2 crore has been directly transferred into the account of 2,27,335 farmers.
- Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY): During the last three years beginning from 2018-19 to 2020-21 financial year, 3,01,118 farmers have been covered under the programme.
- Paddy cultivation in SRI system: During the last three years in SRI system high yielding paddy has been cultivated over 1,27,898 ha. area and hybrid paddy has been cultivated over 1,58,640 ha. area.
- During the last three years a total of 21,531 agri-instruments and equipments have been distributed among the farmers. Besides, during the last three years 6000 ha. area has been brought under organic farming in different clusters. And initiative has been taken to bring more 15,000 ha. land under organic farming during the current financial year.
- Decision has been taken to launch Mukhyamantri Fasal Bima Yojana, Chief Minister's Assured Irrigation Programme and Chief Minister Bargadar (Landless) Yojana.

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02 Horticulture

- During the 2018-19 financial year 2,083 MT pineapple has been exported to different states of the country and 10 MT pineapple has been exported to Dubai.
- A digital logo of pineapple has been launched to have wider publicity for Tripura pineapple at the national and international level. To facilitate export of pineapple solar-based cold storages have been constructed at the Horti-Research Complex of Nagichera, Bilaschera in Dhalai district and at Chhataria in Gomati district during 2019-20 financial year.
- To increase production of pineapple in the state 500 ha. land was brought under pineapple cultivation in 2018-19 financial year and pineapple cultivation in staggering system has been done over 100 ha. area in 2019-20 financial year.
- Moreover during the 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21 financial year 1,300 ha., 1,200 ha. and 2,315 ha. land respectively have been brought under cultivation of fruit and other horti-crops. During 2019-20 financial year pineapple, banana and areca nut have been cultivated in 329 ha. land.
- During 2018-19, 2000 ha. land was brought under high yielding vegetable cultivation. Under the scheme financial assistance was given to 9,000 farmers for vegetable cultivation. During 2019-20 financial year 3,000 ha. land was brought under summer and winter vegetable cultivation thereby benefiting 15,000 vegetable growers. During 2020-21 financial year 2 lakh vegetable saplings were distributed among the farmers and a Centre of Excellence for Vegetable has been established at Birchanda Manu spending Rs. 3.96 crore.
- During 2019-20 financial year target was set for producing tuberlets by using TPS in 100 ha. area. In the process 717 MT TPS tuberlet has been produced and 1,195 ha. land has come under TPS cultivation.
- During lockdown period financial assistance was given to 693 flower cultivators from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund. During the 2020-21 financial year 203 ha. land has been brought under floriculture. For the protection of 98 commercially cultivated exotic flower gardens structures have been constructed in the 2019-20 financial year and similar structures have been constructed for 124 flower gardens in 2020-21 financial year.
- During 2020-21 financial year 195 water harvesting structures have been constructed spending Rs. 1.746 crore.
- Special initiative has been taken for cultivation of dragon fruits in the state. During the current financial year 25 ha. land has been brought under dragon fruit cultivation.
- Special initiative has also been taken for cultivation of black pepper. During 2020-21 financial year 97 ha. land has been brought under black pepper cultivation.

03 Fisheries

- During the last three years 2,13,216.23 MT fish has been produced in the state.
- Rs. 118.48 crore has been spent for economic development of the fish farmers in the state during the last three years.
- During last three years, 1,22,878 fish farmers have benefited under different schemes.
- During the last three years 28,110.01 ha., 28,953.31 ha. and 29,821.91 ha. water area respectively have been brought under fish cultivation.
- Cage fish farming: Initiative has been taken to install 1500 cages in Dumboor Lake for fish farming spending Rs. 22.65 crore.
- During the last three financial years 54.61 lakh fingerlings have been released in Dumboor Lake and another 28.70 lakh fingerlings have been released in Chakmaghat barrage, Feni, Gomati, Khowai, Juri, Deo, Manu and Howrah rivers for increasing fish production.

04 Animal Resource Development

- 29,020 Ducks have been provided to 1,000 women beneficiaries of Rudrasagar and the daily production of egg is ranging from 4,000 to 4,500.
- During the year 2017-18, the per capita annual egg production stood at 67.40 no.s which increased to 74.44 no.s during 2019-20.
- During the 2017-18 financial year per capita annual meat production was 11.64 kg, which increased to 12.83 kg during the 2019-20 financial year.
- During the year 2017-18, daily availability of milk per person was 120.85 gram and during 2019-20 it increased to 136.39 gram.

- To increase milk production and maintain its quality two bulk milk cooling units with 5000 and 2000 litre capacity per day have been established.
- The Animal Resources Development department has recently taken initiative to increase number of female calves through artificial insemination in sex sorted semen system under "Mukhyamantri Unnat Godhan Prakalpa". On October 28, 2020 the Hon'ble Chief Minister launched the scheme. So far, sex sorted semen system has been applied to 10,387 cows. This scheme has been started in West Tripura, Sepahijala, Gomati, Khowai and Dhalai district in the first phase.

05 Panchayat

- During the last three years on account of basic services and development activities Rs. 253.33 crore was given to the Panchayats from the grants of Fourteenth and Fifteenth Finance Commission. Skill development training has been given to 34,858 people including 14,263 elected representatives and 20,595 employees during the said period.
- Panchayat Monitoring System has been developed for the Panchayat Secretary, Village Secretary and Rural Programme Managers.
- With the grants of Panchayat Development Fund and Fourteenth Finance Commission development of 14,260.74 km. road was executed. During the last three years total 38,40,448 mandays have been generated with Panchayat Development Fund.
- As a token of recognition of good work Nanaji Deshmukh Rashtriya Gourab Gram Sabha Puraskar, Child Friendly Gram Panchayat Award, Deen Dayal Upadhyay Panchayat Sashaktikaran Puraskar etc. awards were given to different panchayats.

06 Handloom, Handicrafts & Sericulture

- For the development of sericulture industry a centrally sponsored scheme has been approved for Sepahijala.
- Work sheds have been constructed for 340 weavers under North East Region Textile Promotion Scheme (NERTPS). In addition, 17 designers have been engaged in each NERTPS cluster to assist the handloom weavers for development of new design. Group workshops have been constructed for 13 clusters.
- For providing social security to handloom weavers 667 weavers have been enrolled under Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY) and process is underway to include 1000 more artisans in the scheme during the 2020-21 financial year.
- 170 Handloom artisans have been given training and 77 artisans have been provided with equipments. In different blocks four-month long training for 120 handloom artisans has started. Skill development training has also been imparted to 150 handicraft artisans.
- National Handloom Expo was organized in Tripura and Sikkim to market the products of handloom artisans.
- Assistance has been given to a total of 2,096 beneficiaries for cocoon cultivation and 1,420 acre area has been brought under cocoon cultivation.
- Printing on silk fabrics woven with the state's own silk yarn is going on at the silk processing and printing unit established with Central assistance.

07 Industry & Commerce – enterprising Tripura

- On 11th September, 2020, foundation stone has been laid for a Multi-Sector SEZ at Jalefa near Sabroom and implementation of the project is going on in full swing.
- Two border haats, one at Kamalpur of Dhalai district and another at Palbasti (Raghna) of North Tripura district are being set up.
- Total 3,974 MSME units have been established under Swabalamban scheme. Consequently employment has been generated for 11,375 beneficiaries.
- Employment for 19,816 people has been generated through establishment of 2,477 MSME units under PMEGP.
- Under the Tripura Industrial Investment Promotion Incentives Scheme during the last 34 months employment has been generated for total 32,210 people through establishment of 5,267 MSME units in the state.
- In order to increase production of agarbatti and agarbatti sticks in the state 'Mukhyamantri Agarbatti Atmnirbhar Mission' has been launched. Under the programme employment of 5000 people will be ensured with an investment of Rs. 75 crore.
- Total 1552 MSME units in 2018-19 financial year, 1491 MSME units in 2019-20 financial year and till January 31, of 2020-21 financial year, 2,165 MSME units have been established in the state.

08 Forest

- During the last two and half years, total 14,152.71 ha. has been brought under plantation for maintaining ecological balance and afforestation. Roadside plantation has been done over a stretch of 1,044.9 km. and tree plantation has also been done on 912.5 km. river bank. Bamboo plantation of total 645.05 ha. has been done by vacating 674.25 ha. land under ganja cultivation for the purpose of forest conservation.
- During the last two financial years 234 check-dams have been constructed. Work is going on for constructing more 1,447 check dams. This will benefit 75,000 people.
- The forest department has created eight Smriti Van(s). For the purpose of beautification roadside plantation has been done over a stretch of 378.19 km.

09 Food, Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs

- To increase the income of paddy farmers, at the rate of Rs. 1750 per quintal 10,406.97 MT paddy has been procured during the 2018-19 financial year and in 2019-20 financial year 29,757.86 MT paddy has been procured at the rate of Rs. 1815 per quintal. During the current financial year (upto 16-02-2021) 19,818 MT paddy has been procured at the rate of Rs. 18.68 per kg. thereby transferring an amount of Rs. 36.56 crore into the accounts of farmers.
- Under 'Pradhan Mantri Gareeb Kalyan Yojana', 5.79 lakh NFSA families were provided with 95,025.036 MT Rice and 4,381 MT Dal per ration card from April to November, 2020.
- It has been decided that each of 50,000 poor APL families would be given Rs. 1000 financial assistance through direct benefit transfer from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund. So far, Rs. 4.4093 crore has been transferred into the accounts of 44,093 families.
- From December 1, 2019, intra-state portability of ration cards has been introduced for all the ration card holders. Inter-state portability has been introduced from January 1, 2020 for only NFSA ration card holders.
- From May 2018, e-point of sale has been launched for AADHAAR based bio-metric transactions in the public distribution system. At present online version of e-point of sale machines are functional in 1,800 ration shops out of 1,821 ration shops.

10 Infrastructure Development

- The Union Minister of Road Transport & Highways virtually inaugurated 9 highways of 262 km. length and two concrete bridges on October 27, 2020. The estimated financial involvement in these projects was Rs. 2,752 crore.
- In Sabroom construction of Moitri Setu over Feni River is almost complete.
- Construction and widening work of 159.23 km. road has been completed under CRF programme. Development work of Melagarh-Sonamura road (8.45 KM) and Pecharthal-Kanchanpur road (24.855 KM) has been completed. Development work of 80.84 KM stretch of the Bishalgarh-Boxanagar-Sonamura-Barpathari-Belonia road has been completed till now. Work of 16.61 km stretch of the Udaipur-Melagarh road has been completed.
- The Union Minister for Road Transport, through 'e-Foundation laying ceremony' has announced four new big projects for Tripura. Estimated expenditure for these projects has been calculated at Rs. 7530.00 crore.
- During the last three years 39 RCC bridges and 41 box culverts have been constructed. About 400 km. road has been renovated.
- Under the PWD (R&B) work of 21 projects in 2018-19 financial year, 48 projects in 2019-20 financial year and 48 projects till January, 2021 of the current financial year has been completed.
- Construction of 16 buildings including that of different schools of the school education department, administrative and academic buildings of Joint Entrance Board, District Institute for Educational Trainings has been completed.
- Construction of one building under general administration department, one building of fire services, three buildings of food and civil supplies department, cafeteria at Akhaura border and Phuldungsei tourist lodge under the department of tourism has been completed.
- Construction of three 100-bedded and one 50-bedded hostels for the boys and girls respectively under the tribal welfare department, Haj Bhavan at Melarmath under the minorities welfare department, three school buildings in Sonamura and one school in Belonia has been completed.
- Under the higher education department construction of Birchandra State Central Library, polytechnic workshop building, model degree college, administrative building, general degree college totaling 12 buildings has been completed.
- Under the health department construction of 53 buildings including primary health centres, quarters, community health centres, district warehouse, CMO office and quarters, cancer hospital, nurses training institute, administrative building of IGM Hospital etc. has been completed.

11 Transport

- A new terminal building with all modern facilities is being constructed at MBB Airport. So far 95 per cent work has been completed.
- To facilitate rail transportation of goods rail yards are being constructed at Nischintapur on the Agartala-Akhaura rail line and at Sabroom in South Tripura district. Construction of Agartala-Akhaura rail line is in final stage and expected to be completed by this year.
- For the convenience of regular commuters and tourists bus services from the airport to Nagerjala and Agartala rail station have been started.
- Srimantapur terminal in Sonamura, on September 5, 2020, has made a place for itself in the India's internal and inter-country water transport network. The Srimantapur terminal has been handed over to the land port authority of India.
- To test and monitor level of pollution by vehicles, 51 PUC centres are operational in the state and detailed report of the same is being uploaded on VAHAN portal.
- At present 23 online services are available through Vahan and Sarathi portal. In this system value can also be made available along with the application.
- Survey work has been completed for extending the Dharmanagar-Kailashahar- Kamalpur-Khowai-Agartala-Belonia rail line. Besides, survey report of Pecharthal-Kailashahar and Dharmanagar rail line has been prepared. Survey for the Feni (Bangladesh) – Belonia (India) rail line has been completed and the report has been submitted to the Railway Board for approval.

12 Information Technology

- In the initial phase all the DM, SDM, BDO offices were brought under SWAN through 2 Mbps lease line. Later on with the increased use of the network the bandwidth was further upgraded to 4/10 Mbps. Till January 2021, 84 SWAN Point of Presence (PoP) have been installed to connect 91 places including these offices. At present SWAN connectivity is available upto Block level.
- Targeting citizen-centric service provision e-District digital service has been launched. At present 44 services are available under e-District.
- e-Office has been introduced in 15 government department / offices to ensure easy, active and transparent paperless service.
- Under Mukhyamantri Yuva Jogajog Yojana, Rs. 5000 has been given to each final year student of college for smart phone purpose. During the 2019-20 financial year out of 8,893 applicants of 38 colleges/universities, this benefit has been given to 7,286 students.
- In order to provide easy service to the public more than 80 websites and 17 applications in various departments have been launched.
- Upto January 2021, 1,809 Common Service Centres (CSC) have been registered in eight districts. Out of the total number 1,481 CSCs are in Panchayat areas. Under the PMG Disha scheme 1,128 training centres have been approved by CSC-SPV. Upto January 2021, 1,43,400 students have been registered with these centres. A total of 94,979 trainings have been conducted through these centres and certificates have been issued to 71,521 students.

13 Science, Technology & Environment

- Tripura Space Application Centre has started mapping of all the police stations in the state.
- To encourage the students in the study of science, a Sub-Regional Science Centre has been set up at Udaipur.
- To promote empowerment of rural women initiative has been taken to set up four Women Technology Parks.
- Three environment-friendly Bio-Villages have been established for development of rural economy. Initiative has been taken to start similar activities in two more bio-villages.
- To monitor the air quality regularly in the city, a Continuous Ambient Air Quality Monitoring System (CAAQMS) has been established.
- A Common Facilitation Centre is being established in Chhecharimal Panchayat under Charilam RD Block to maintain quality in the water filters produced in Tripura.
- To create sustainable livelihood options in SC/ST dominated areas of the state the State Science and Technology Council has taken initiative to form an SC/ST Cell for preparing a scientific and technologically sound plan.

14 Minorities Welfare

- A new scheme has been launched to provide one-time financial assistance to the meritorious students of minority section for pursuing professional courses. This will benefit about 300 students.
- During the period from 2018-19 and 2020-21 (till January) financial year the Ministry of Minorities Welfare, Government of India, has sanctioned Rs. 2013.50 lakh to implement 54 schemes.
- Free coaching is being provided to unemployed minority youth for taking part in different competitive examinations.
- This year Abul Kalam Azad Merit Award and Begum Rokea Gold Medal will be given to 367 minority students of Madhyamik and Higher Secondary level.

15 Pradhan Mantri Gramin Sadak Yojana

- Under Pradhan Mantri Gramin Sadak Yojana-1, 173 habitations have been connected with construction and upgradation of 369.60 km. road. In addition, work of construction 27 more roads has been taken up. The total length of these roads is 98.67 km.
- Under Pradhan Mantri Gramin Sadak Yojana-2 for upgradation of 42 roads the Ministry of Rural Development has sanctioned Rs. 333.30 crore. Total length of these roads is 307 km. out of which tender for 257.58 km stretch has been finalised.

16 Nesha Mukta Tripura

- In addition to recovery of 93,109 kg Ganja, in the state 41,61,696 intoxicating tablets, 9,836.99 gm. Heroin and 4,20,148 bottles of cough syrup have been detained.
- A total of 1,660 people have been arrested so far and 398 vehicles have been detained and 1026 Cases have been lodged.

17 Rural livelihood

- With a view to creating employment for the rural people employment has been given to 5.82 lakh families during the current financial year.
- Under MGNREGA, compared to 2017-18 financial year, increase in madays generated has been 95 per cent in 2019-20 financial year. In 2019-20 average 61 mandays have been generated in the state and average 82 mandays have been generated in 12 Aspirational Blocks.
- During the period from April 2020 to January 2021, total 369.24 lakh mandays have been generated under MGNREGA. With this, average created mandays stood at 63 days in the state and 85 days in Aspirational Blocks.

18 Water Resources

- Under the initiative of the water resources department total 32 deep tube wells have been installed during the last three years. With this, 640 ha. land of the state has come under irrigation.
- Three lift irrigation schemes have been commissioned thereby ensuring irrigation in 80 ha. land.

19 Employment Services & Manpower Planning

- During the last three years 29 job fairs were organised. A total of 11,446 candidates participated in these fairs. And 1,143 candidates found employment through these job fairs.
- On approval by the state cabinet Joint Recruitment Board has been constituted for recruiting Group-C and Group-D staff. Accordingly notification has been issued for recruitment into the 4,910 vacant posts.
- For recruiting in different departments through outsourcing the Employment Services and Manpower Planning authority has registered agency.
- To facilitate dissemination of information on jobs weekly career bulletin is being published and for the benefit of aspiring candidates in terms of preparation career corners will be opened in two MCs by March 2021.

3 Years of PEOPLE'S GOVERNMENT

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*Tripura on Road
to Self-Reliance*

01 Tribal Empowerment

- The Agartala Airport has been renamed after the architect of modern Tripura Maharaja Bir Bikram Manikya and 19th August, the birth day of Maharaja has been declared a government holiday.
- Through a tripartite agreement the 23 year old Reang (Bru) refugee issue has been solved and initiative has been taken to rehabilitate the refugees.
- Twelve tribal-dominated Blocks of the state have been declared Aspirational Blocks.
- The Tribal Welfare Department has been renamed as Janjati Kalyan department.
- For marketing of the forest products, under the Pradhan Mantri Van Dhan Yojana, apart from setting up of 17 Van Dhan Kendras, the Central government has given approval for more 10 Van Dhan Kendras.
- Construction of three hostels for the tribal girl students studying in colleges of the state and one hostel in Meghalaya for the girl students has been taken up.
- The decision of the state cabinet to rename TTAADC as 'Tipra Territorial Council' has been sent to the Central Government for approval.
- Initiative has been taken to establish 18 new Eklavya Model Schools in tribal dominated areas.
- Apart from post-Matric scholarship, Rs. 1 lakh one time financial assistance will be given to the meritorious tribal students.
- Initiative has been taken to identify patta land and give registration of ownership by using new technology.

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02 Healthy Tripura, Healthy India

- Due to improved health services in the state the infection and death rate from TB and malaria, child mortality, death rate in delivery has come down and total fertility rate has improved remarkably.
- E-Hospital service including registration of patients through mobile is fully functional in 21 hospitals of the state.
- Due to improved health services, the number of referred cases to other states has gradually reduced. During the 2018-19 financial year 2,438 patients were referred outside, in 2019-20 financial year it came down to 2,289 and till January 31 of the 2020-21 year only 792 patients were referred outside.
- Under the Tripura Health Assurance Scheme for Poor (THASP), Rs. 9,82,31,682 has been disbursed to 1,714 beneficiaries during the period from April, 2018 to January, 2021.
- Specialist OPD has been launched in five primary health centres of city outskirts.
- A total of 11,56,434 e-Cards have been distributed during the last three years (till January 31, 2021) under Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana.
- During the last three years total 87, 146 unit blood has been collected through 1,862 voluntary blood donation camps.
- In Agartala Medical College seat capacity in post-graduate courses has been increased by 16 and seat capacity in MBBS course has been increased by 25 and 10 per cent seats will be reserved for the students of economically weaker section.
- A DPR is being prepared for establishing a medical college in Dhulai district.
- Four new nursing institutes have been opened. 275 Seats have been added to different nursing courses.

03 Human Resource Development – Sushikshit Tripura

- During 2019-20 and 2020-21 academic year 28 and 35 Bengali medium schools respectively have been converted to English medium schools. Twenty schools under TBSE have been brought under CBSE.
- During the lockdown period all the text books of first to twelfth standard have been digitized and uploaded on the SCERT website.
- Bachhar Bachao: Those who have been unsuccessful in maximum two subjects in Madhyamik and Higher Secondary examinations they could appear for re-examination within two months. Taking advantage of this facility 3,277 students have cleared Madhyamik and 1,194 students have cleared Higher Secondary examination.
- Super 30: The state government has launched a new scheme called Super-30 to arrange coaching for the top 30 students of Madhyamik to prepare them for Engineering and Medical entrance examinations.
- To prepare for IAS examination financial assistance of Rs. 1.2 lakh is being provided to aspiring candidates under a scheme called 'Lakshya'.
- Loan facility has been offered to the students going for B.Ed. course in and outside the state under Mukhyamantri B.Ed. Anuprerna Yojana.
- The first IIIT in Tripura has started functioning from the campus of NIT, Agartala.
- From the current academic session M. Tech. in Computer Science and Engineering, Mechanical Engineering and Electronics, Communications Engineering courses have been introduced in TIT and during the last three years four engineering branches have received NBA recognition.
- From this academic year I. M. D. in Commerce and Chemistry has been introduced in MBB University.
- Natun Disha: This scheme was launched for quality upgradation of learning in elementary level. In 2018-19 the percentage of class-appropriate students was 43.2. Due to this scheme this percentage has improved to 84.43.
- During the last three years Apple I-pad was given to each of 274 students who excelled in Madhyamik and Higher Secondary examinations under the Chief Minister's Award for Academic Excellence.
- During the 2018-19 and 2019-20 financial year bi-cycles were given to 54,536 girl students of class IX irrespective of their family income.
- Under the secondary education department 444 GT/PGT teachers were recruited on the recommendations of TRBT during 2019 and 2020. Besides, in 2020-21 financial year two more PGT were appointed. Under the elementary education department 327 GT/UGT were recruited on the recommendations of TRBT in 2019 and 2020. Further, in the 2020-21 also 859 GT/UGT were recruited.

04 SC Welfare

- During the last three years (till January 2021), pre-Matric scholarship was given to a total of 59,634 students (Class VI to VIII) and post-Matric scholarship was given to 35,241 SC students.

- Skill development training on different subjects is being given to 2,440 unemployed youths.
- During the last three years Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Award has been given to 20,790 SC students of Class VI to XII who have secured 60 per cent or more.
- Every year top ten SC students of Madhyamik and Higher Secondary examination are getting Rs. 25,000 cash award, gold medal and a certificate.
- 250 SC students have been sponsored for studying B.Sc, GNM, B.Ed., D.El. Ed., Nursing and Medical etc. courses in and outside the state during the 2018-19 and 2019-20 financial year.
- The loan disbursal system has been simplified for the loan from SC/ST/OBC Corporation. As a result, now onward, contractual employee, DRW, pump operator, Anganwadi Workers can also become guarantor for loan.

05 Tripura – a Popular Destination for Tourists

- In February, 2020, State Tourism Policy has been adopted.
- To develop the tourism infrastructure in the state a project proposal worth Rs. 500 crore has been sent to Asian Development Bank.
- Soft loan upto Rs. 5 lakh will be given to enterprising unemployed youths willing to invest in tourism industry.
- Service of Guide has been introduced at Ujjayanta Palace and Neermahal. Tourist Information Centres have been opened at Guwahati airport and Akhaura check-post for the convenience of the tourists. Battery-operated cart service has been launched at Ujjayanta Palace, Akhaura Check-Post, Sepahijala sanctuary, Tepania Eco Park, and new Secretariat complex. Floating jetty has been established in Rudrasagar, Chhabimura and Dumboor Lake.
- To attract tourists, 16 log-huts have been constructed in Hataikatar Eco Park, Sepahijala sanctuary, Tepania Eco Park, Ambassa Eco Park and already 13 of them have been opened for the visitors.
- Speed boat service has been introduced in Dumboor Lake and for Chhabimura. In addition water scooters have been launched in Dumboor Lake.
- Salka Cafeteria has been opened at Rungthang Eco Park in Sepahijala district and Judai Tourist Lodge has been opened at Phuldungsei in North Tripura district.

06 Social Welfare and Social Education

- From September, 2020, arrangement has been made for ensuring additional nutrition for the children suffering from acute malnutrition under Poshan Abhiyan. For this purpose 10,145 smart phones have been distributed among the ICDS Supervisor and Anganwadi workers.
- In line with the 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao' scheme of the Central government, 'Tripura Beti Bachao Beti Padhao' scheme has been launched. This scheme is being implemented in seven districts of the state, except South Tripura district.
- Under all social security pension schemes monthly financial assistance has been increased from Rs. 700 to Rs. 1000. More 30,000 persons are being brought under different social pension schemes.
- LPG connections have been ensured in 3,874 Anganwadi Centres.
- Under 'Mukhyamantri Matrupushti Upahar' scheme kits of nutritious food are being given to pregnant women four times. Under the scheme each pregnant woman is entitled to food items worth Rs. 500.
- To act as interface between public and police 441 women police volunteers have been appointed to fight against atrocities on women. These volunteers will report on incidents of atrocities on women to the appropriate authority.
- During the last 34 months, Rs. 5000 financial assistance has been given to each of 58,060 beneficiaries under Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana.

07 OBC Welfare

- Top ten students of Madhyamik and Higher Secondary examinations and those who secure first division are being felicitated with Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Gold Medal and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Award and cash prizes.
- Pre and post-Matric scholarship amounting Rs. 6,227.05 lakh has been disbursed to 1,51,372 students.
- To pursue GNM and paramedical course Rs. 129.45 lakh has been given to 100 financially weak OBC students.
- A total of 280 students have been facilitated with Rs. 259.51 lakh financial assistance.
- Upto 2019-20 academic year 20 students have been nominated for Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Gold Medal and 4,106 students have been nominated for Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Memorial Award.
- Total Rs. 24.13 lakh has been given to 834 economically poor OBC patients for treatment purpose.
- Besides, soft loans worth Rs. 4,128.31 lakh have been disbursed to 2,397 OBC beneficiaries under various self-employment schemes.

08 Co-operative

- Each Gram Panchayat and ADC Village has achieved 100 per cent success in forming at least one co-operative society.
- During lockdown period seasonal harvest of the farmers were procured and marketed through 143 co-operative societies at minimum support price.
- With the approval of the state government through 'Pradhan Mantri Bharatiya Janaushodi Pariyojana' (PMBJP) Scheme necessary medicines are being supplied to the common people at reasonable rate.
- Proper marketing arrangement has been done for the oranges grown in Jampui, Killa and Hataikatar (Baramura) areas through MARKFED.
- 144 Orientation and training camps have been organised during the period from March 2018 to January 2021 to generate awareness among the rural people about Cooperative for socio-economic development.
- Tripura State Cooperative Bank has launched three mobile ATM and e-Stamping facility for land transactions from March 2018 in different sub-divisions.
- In the state there were 1957, 3278 and 3576 cooperative societies and 8092, 8368 and 8508 NGOs in the 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21 financial year respectively.
- As per the Tripura Co-operative Act, 1974, registration of a co-operative society has been opened online on SWAAGAT portal under Ease of Doing Business policy.

09 Revenue

- To ensure on-time service delivery to the citizens of the state, the Tripura Guaranteed Service to Citizen Act 2020 and Tripura Guaranteed Service to Citizen Rules 2020 have been formulated.
- The Indian Stamp Act 1899 (2 of 1899), Court Fees Act, 1870, Tripura Land Revenue and Land Reforms (Allotment of Land) (Eight Amendment) Rules, 2020, Tripura Land Records and Land Reforms (Eleventh Amendment) Act, 2020 have been amended and online service has been launched. E-Stamping system has been made operational since 2019. From February, 2020, valuation of lands has been amended.
- The Hon'ble Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb launched the web portal of Tripura Sundari Temple on December 5, 2020.
- Total 145 youths of the state have been trained on survey work and on completion of the course they have been given certificates.
- Financial assistance has been given to the people of Tripura who had been stranded in Tripura Bhavans and different states during COVID-19 pandemic. Rent of Tripura Bhavan has been waived off and initiative has been taken to bring back the stranded people.
- Initiative has been taken to rehabilitate the Reang refugees. For this purpose 229 ha. areas in the state have been identified. The identified areas include 220 ha. forest land and 9 ha. Khas land.
- To keep telecommunication system in operation during disaster time 24 satellite phones have been procured. In addition, initiative has been taken to operate HAM radio stations in the capital and districts during disaster period. This work will be completed by March 31, 2021. To generate awareness about disaster management mock drills are being held regularly and initiative has been taken to procure nine drones, 40 rubber motor boats for emergency situations.
- Demarcation of RoFR land, data entry of RoFR plot has been launched. So far 71,103 out of 1,21,413 RoFR pattas have been updated.

10 Drinking Water and Sanitation

- During the year 2020-21, as per the state government's plan, sinking of 174 Deep Tube Wells has been completed. 106 Deep Tube wells have been commissioned, 28 deep tube wells are awaiting commissioning and work is in progress for 70 more.
- On March 2, 2019, Tripura was declared an ODF State.
- Under Atal Jal Dhara Mission every household will be provided drinking water through pipe line by 15th August 2022. Till date, 2,79,686 households have been connected under this programme.
- 133 Small bore deep tube wells have been installed and commissioned, 134 more are awaiting commissioning and work is under progress for 191 more.
- Two Innovative Schemes have been made functional and work of 52 Innovative Schemes is going on.
- 512.55 km. pipeline has been extended and work for extension of 637.16 km. pipeline is under progress.
- For 100 per cent sanitation coverage construction of toilets for every household is going on. During 2020-21, total 37,109 toilets have been constructed and works for 24,335 numbers of toilets is in progress. And 13 community toilets have been completed.
